

· Museum Update September 5th 2016

We are sad to say that following the theft of two patches from flight suits in the museum we have been forced to remove all patches, medal ribbons and name badges (unless sewn on) from all uniforms and flight suits within the museum. The two patches stolen were the 'Got Nukes' patch illustrated below and an Aerospace Rescue & Recovery Service 'Angel' patch. Although these two patches were attached with velcro, we had taken additional measures of tack stitching them on as well. The thief had cut the tack stitches before removing the patches from the flight suits. We apologise for having to take this action but unfortunately this has been forced upon us.





· Bentwaters Airfield Walk - Sunday October 9th 2016 - NOW FULLY BOOKED (30th August 2016)

Experience a chance to walk around Bentwaters and sample the atmosphere of a Cold War airfield and view the architecture of a former United States Air Force front line air base

· Bentwaters Airfield tour - Sunday 11th September 2016

This is a unique opportunity to see what went on behind the scenes at Bentwaters during the Cold War. The day will include a trip by coach around the airfield and museum and stopping at key points around the airfield. This will include areas such as the control tower, Hush House, weapons store, fuel section, some of the squadron buildings and our own restoration hangar. The trip lasts around 4 hours and also includes the museum.

This has to be booked in advance and can be done by emailing info@bcwm.org.uk or via our website contact page or by phoning the museum on 07588877020.

Prices are £15 per person payable in advance (cheques should be made payable to Bentwaters Aviation Society). BAS members can attend for free, but still have to be booked in. You can also pay using PayPal by visiting the BAS website here.

The museum will be open from 10am for pre -booked only and the airfield tour will start at 11am. The café will be open for light snacks between 10am and 11am and will be open again after the tour. However you are more than welcome to bring your own lunch while on the tour. Spaces are limited so please book early.








· Classic Car Show on the 17th April 2016

· Bentwaters Cold War Museum at Night Event - 23rd April 2016

Opening times: 7.00pm to 10.00pm

Following on from the successful first event last year, Bentwaters Cold War Museum will be opening its doors in the evening to hold a special opening in the evening with floodlit aircraft and live re-enactment by museum staff in the Cold War Command Post Bunker who will bring to life the ominous prospect of impending war that the world faced when the superpowers of the USA and the Soviet Union opposed each other.

Guided tours of the museum will be available at intervals plus films and photo opportunities both in the Command Post and outside with the aircraft, all arranged to maximise the visitor experience.

Admission is the normal price of £5.00 with children free. Hot drinks will be available in the museum café.

· A-10 Update - March 19th 2016

Work is continuing on the dismantling and movement of the A-10 from RAF Alconbury, and work is ongoing to prepare the aircraft for transport. It is expected to arrive at the museum during April 2016

The Bentwaters Cold War Museum wishes to announce that it has been successful in its bid to acquire an A-10 Thunderbolt on loan from the National Museum of the USAF. The airframe in question is an ex-509th TFS/81st TFW Bentwaters-based jet and is currently residing at RAF Alconbury. It is hoped that the A-10 will be on display for the first opening of 2016 which will be Easter Sunday.

To say that we are pleased to be returning a Warthog to Bentwaters is an understatement. Our thanks must go to all the USAF and NMUSAF personnel involved in achieving what started off as a pipe dream back in 2003, four years before we first opened our doors to the public. Hopefully this will be a very successful 2016 for BCWM!


$\cdot\,$ Restoration at the BCWM isn't just about aircraft.

The BCWM has a small tug that has recently started being restored to it's former glory – a brief history and some images of the process can be seen below.

The Jeep CJ-10a was contract built for the US Air Force as a tug to move around flightline equipment and Aircraft. There were approx. 2188 made built between 1984-1986 in the VAM factory Mexico.

The flight line tugs had some special features to make them better for towing, and most of this centred around weight. These are heavy, a lot heavier that they look! The front bumper is 1/2 inch channel, and had a large pintle hitch. The rear bumper is thick and heavy as well, and has 3 huge pintle's, with the center one being moveable for easy hookup. They also have a large weight box under the "bed" that weighs 12-1400 lbs. All together they weigh in the 6000 lb stock.

Besides the weight and the bed, the CJ is a right old mixture of "spare parts". Front axle is 'dead' power is by the rear axle only and this is 80 inches wide with a limited slip. The engine is a Nissan SD-33 diesel, transmission is an odd ball TF727 with a Dodge Industrial 440 Big Block bell housing with no shift fork, stuck in 4 low. Top speed is 25 MPH, the wheel base is a short 88 inches.
